Diwali Celebration is at the Bowmanville Library on October 11, 10:30am, with Celebrate Clarington Culture: Islamic History Month at the Newcastle Library on October 19, 2pm and Islamic History Month Storytime at the Bowmanville Library on October 25, 10:30am. For newcomers, English Conversation Circles are being expanded, held in-person at Bowmanville Library on Monday evenings at 6:30pm, and online on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30pm. Multilingual storytimes have also been expanded, with all-ages storytimes offered in French, Hindi & Urdu, Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish throughout the fall.

In addition to the full slate of programs and events, all CLMA library locations offer growing collections in different languages. Materials are currently available in Arabic, Chinese, Dutch, Farsi, French, Hindi, Polish, Spanish, Tagalog, Tamil, Ukrainian, and Urdu. CLMA is also seeking to expand its collections to include Punjabi materials and children's storytime kits in Arabic and Tamil.
