Seven Fallen Feathers by Tanya Talaga

- 1. What did you like the most about *Seven Fallen Feathers*? What aspects of the book did you find challenging?
- 2. How do you see the racism embedded in public institutions adding to the problems of Indigenous youth in Northern communities?
- 3. What more should the federal government be doing to support Indigenous communities across Canada?
- 4. What role can we play as individuals in promoting justice and equality for Indigenous youth?
- 5. Talaga asks in the epilogue: "Can the settlers and the Indigenous people come together as one and move forward in harmony?" Discuss this question.
- 6. What do you think Talaga intended to convey by giving readers intimate portraits of the youths' lives?
- 7. How did this book influence your thoughts on the institutional racism faced by Indigenous peoples in Canada as well as the legacy of the terrible harms done by the residential schools?

Booking a Kit

- Booking may be made up to a year in advance.
- Please check the calendar accessible on our website for availability.
- Fill out the form with your information, and a staff member will be in touch to confirm your booking.
- Pick up your hold at the service desk. Your notification may come in a few days early, but it will remain available until your specified pick-up date.

Terms of Loan

- 12 copies are included in each kit.
- 6-week loan period.
- No renewals.
- Kit may be picked up at or returned to any CLMA library location.
- Kit must be returned at the service desk during operating hours, not through an exterior drop box.
- All items are checked out to one person's card.
- The person who borrowed the kit is responsible for:
 - \circ The distribution and return of all items to their group members; and
 - Any damages to the books/bag, or lost items.
 - The cost of a damaged or lost book varies depending on the item.
